### 260.1. Chairman's Comments.

Shiona welcomed everyone with a special welcome to David Adams, who is a Renewable Energy worker with Angus Council.

#### 260.2. Police Matters.

Gwen reported on current Police matters.

The attention of the public is drawn to a pilot project "Keeping Children Safe Sex Offenders Disclosure Pilot" being run by Tayside Police. In this project any member of the public, who has concerns about a person with access to a child, can ask the police for disclosure of their recent convictions. Disclosure of information will only be made when the person is a Registered Sex Offender with convictions relating to children and there is risk. There have been 25 enquiries to date and the pilot will run until 31 May, before evaluation and a decision on its future. Leaflets on the project are available from Police and social work offices. Further advice can be obtained by contacting the police on 0300 111 2222.

Other issues getting prominence include: alcohol abuse by youths; reckless conduct after taking "bubbles" (similar to MDMA); card skimming at ATM machines; poisoning of protected birds (white eagles)

### 260.3. RENEWABLE ENERGY for The Hall

David Adams reported on the work he had been carrying out in Angus for village hall and the studies he has been making for our own hall. He has looked at the various options for providing heating for the hall by renewable energy and expects to have all the necessary information available to him soon, so that he can make recommendations. Biomass boilers (or stoves) seem to be the best option. He hopes to report to the Hall AGM on 29<sup>th</sup> April.
