281.1. Chairman's Comments

281.3. Matters Arising

a). Police Matters. Steve gave a full report: -

The mobile library (it comes to Auchterhouse each Thursday alternately morning and late afternoon) is available for consultation with Council officers and Tayside Police. Steve will join the van from time to time at Auchterhouse stop.

The theft of heating oil is still happening. Keep tanks locked.

Beware this is the peak season for the theft of garden equipment. A lawn mower has been stolen from a property in our area. Leave garden equipment out of sight preferably in a locked shed.

Road policing issues highlighted include: danger of motor cycling accidents as there are more of these cyclist on the roads especially in the summer; offences of speeding, drink driving, using phones while driving, being uninsured and not using seat belts

c). TACTRAN / STPR.

The next TACTRAN Board meeting will be on 12 June after new councillors have been appointed.

Graeme Dey MSP has written to say that his position on the listing of the Dundee Northern Relief road remains the same (that it will never happen) and there is no need to remove it from the STPR list, (as we have requested), but we are welcome to come and speak to him. Other CC's and councillors are putting pressure on him.

The draft Angus Local Plan is now expected to go before the Council in Sep/Oct this year.

Funding may be available but this pursuit needs further investigation especially on safety and liability issues. Clive agreed to speak to those who might be interested and determine what they are looking for.
