# Police matters raised by our community PC Gail Beattie

#### Road and traffic matters

Road repairs on the Brae and a length of resurfacing on Bonnyton Road (near High Bonnyton) have been carried out. Repair work on Dronley Road, south of Eastfield Steading, has been requested.



#### **BT Phone Box**

We have decided to go ahead with cleaning the box, repainting it and installing a defibrillator in a secure box. When we get quotes for this work an application will be made to Awards4All for funding.

# **Planning**

# **Dronley Community Woodland**

Our Consultant, Duncan Bryden, has finally completed the feasibility study and business plan for the Woodland. This represents a major step forward as the plan is key to submitting an application to the Forestry Commission under the Community Asset Transfer Scheme (CATS). The trustees are now completing the application form which makes our case for the transfer of the woodland to our community. An independent panel will review our application, their decision being centred on us delivering substantive community benefit by owning the woodland. We are confident that we can deliver benefits to the community by making improvements in the wood without compromising the peace and tranquillity the wood offers at present.

New and improved paths will open up more areas of the wood for everyone to enjoy, even those using pushchairs or wheelchairs. Building an accessible wooden off-grid building for recreational and educational activities, a composting toilet and a picnic area are all in our 5 year plan. We hope to employ a part-time woodland manager, to manage the initial work as well as supervising volunteer work teams. We plan to fundraise to employ this person for at least two years.

We plan to put the Business Plan and Feasibility Study on The Dronley Community Woodland website once it has been refreshed. We hope this will be completed within the next month. We hope to make the webpage more interactive to allow feedback.

# AUCHTERHOUSE WEATHER 2017 By John Brush

The mean value of the temperature during 2017 was exactly the same as the mean over the years 1981 to 2010 for Auchterhouse. So no evidence to back global warming there. It appears that there has been a tendency for the winter months to be warmer than normal, but the summer months cooler. Total rainfall was 759.3mms which is considerably less than the average of 879.3mms over the period above. Sunshine records showed that 2017 had 1396.5 hours, very close to the average of 1365.2 hours. Sunniest month was May with 230.8 hours.

An unfortunate cable failure between the anemometer pole in the Glebe and our house put the wind and sunshine recorders out of action for over 3 weeks during November. The sunshine record has been estimated for this period from other close stations but this has been found difficult to do for the wind, especially the speed.

I am grateful to Diarmid Baird for giving me access to the Scotston Farm wind measurements from their wind turbine. The wind measured there is much stronger than at my anemometer but by using these measurements I have managed to estimate the readings.

By the 25th of November a new cable was installed (of higher specification than the old one) and that has worked well since. I must acknowledge the help of Garry Stewart for help in installing the cable. However nearly 170 metres out of the 300 metres of cable await burial as of 16th January 2018. This is a tricky job, considering that the new cable is present. The work can only be done when there is no frost and I hope to have it finished by the spring.



# AUCHTERHOUSE WEATHER 2017 - CONTINUED By John Brush

The highest wind of the year occurred on 11th January at 67mph form the West. I believe there were no gales during November, even though my system recorded incorrect speeds during the failure period. During the year there were 16 days when snow/sleet fell and 11 days when snow was lying. This seems to be about average in recent years although the years of 2013 and especially 2010 had far more days when snow fell and lay.

Another interesting measure is the number of days when the temperature exceeded 21°C. This was only 7 for the year 2017. For 2016 this number was 13 and for 2015 it was 8. For 2014 it was 18 and for 2013 it was 25, possibly the best summer in recent memory. During 2013 the best month was July with 15 days over 21°C.

Much of the station is quite old now and is long overdue for replacement. The sunshine recorder was replaced during the summer (the old one had operated since 1996). I will endeavour to keep the weather station going as long as I can, but I am getting old too!


