Police matters

PC Steve Wilson is now able to attend our meetings and the Police Consultative Document is being continued giving us a monthly update on: - police performance; recent crimes in the area; road policy issues and local initiatives. This is a much welcomed development. There have been some attempted break-ins to house and outbuildings, so make sure your property is kept secure and report anything suspicious to Police Scotland on 101.



Road and traffic matters

The closure of the road south of The Avenue has now ended after over 6 weeks of diversions which put a lot of traffic and strain on the Dronley and Bonnyton roads. However the new larger road drain which has been installed (only part way up The Avenue – the rest to follow next year) will make a big improvement in times of heavy or prolonged rain, when in the past, a torrent would flow down this road to the road-end. The path to the road end is now continuous from the village after a section was added leading up to the path under the old railway bridge.



Planning applications

A sun lounge extension to the farmhouse at The Neuk farm has been approved, but the demolition of the steading and erection of 4 new houses is awaiting a decision.

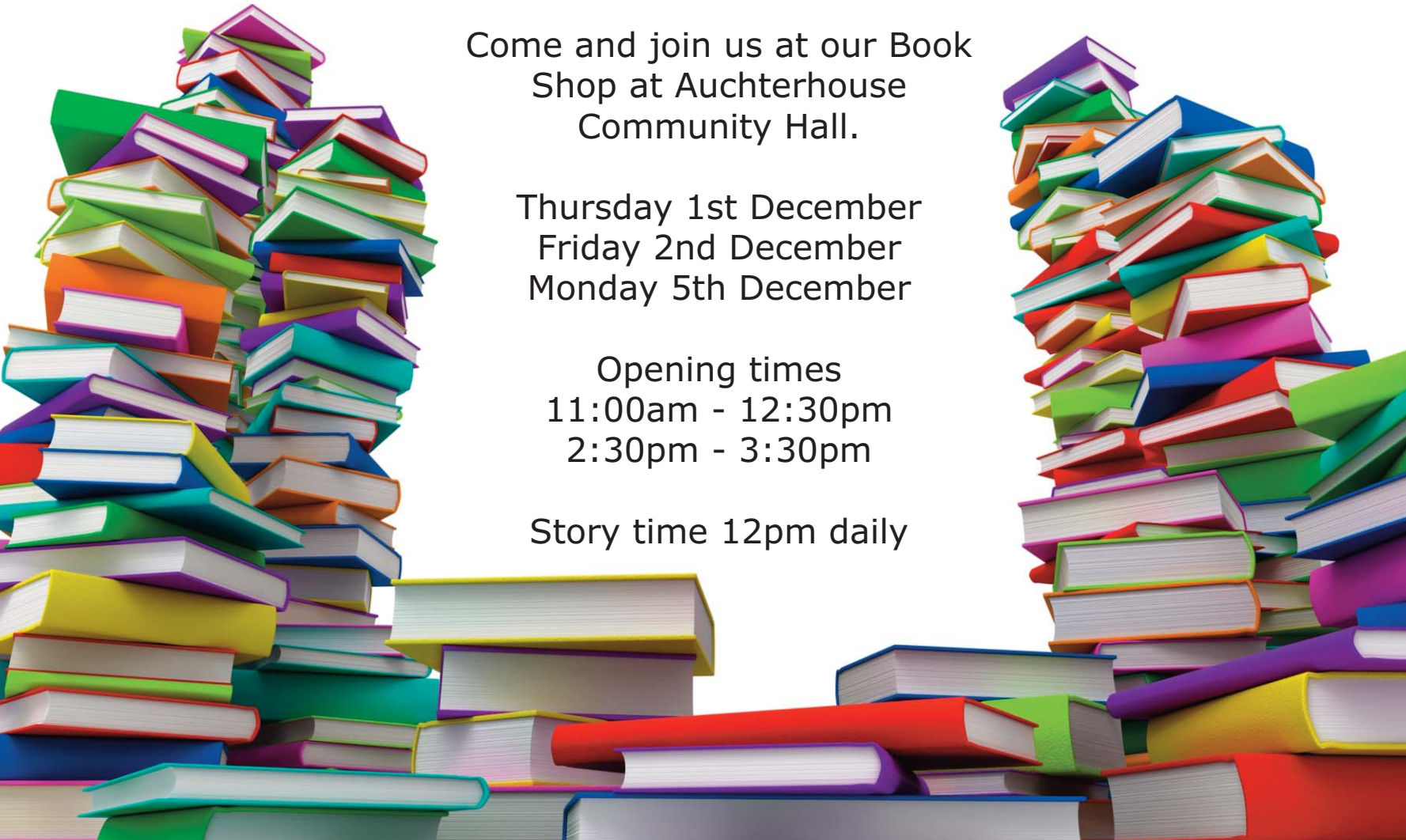
