Community Council Update - March to May



Village Hall Improvements

The CC plans to install electric charging points in the Village Hall car park. Pricing is being discussed with more information needed. Watch this space.

The CC has been awarded with £1,200 for IT funding. Initially the fund will be spent on a WiFi connection and a wall mounted projector.

The CC have been provided with £200 for period poverty to raise awareness of free product locations and eradicate period poverty in Angus.



Auchterhouse Park & Public Toilets

The leak outside the toilet in the park has been fixed

New windows have been fitted into the toilet at the park by Angus Council

A request for covered picnic shelter in the park was discussed. The CC will draw up a plan to share with Angus Council for review.



Road/Traffic Matters

Dronley Road junction work hasn't happened yet but Angus Council will do so when budget becomes available. The Council has been contacted to determine when this will happen

Community Council Update - March to May

Planning - Minuted at ACC meeting on 21/4/22

There have been two new planning applications since the last meeting, both awaiting a decision:

22/00194/FULL - new side extension for living room and bedroom at Lisheen, The Brae, DD3 ORE - current update - now approved.

22/00213/FULL - installation of platform lift, motor room and new ground floor and first floor doors at 14 Braeside, DD3 0RE

There are updates on two earlier applications:21/00851FULL - alterations at Newton of Auchterhouse Farm DD2 5PB - approved
21/00750FULL - conversion and extension of mill building to form a dwelling house - still
awaiting a decision (since October)

22/00294/PAN is a planning application notification by Muir homes for up to 90 houses, farm shop, orchards etc on land on either side of the Newtyle Road (B954) and adjacent to the Coupar Angus Road (A923) on the north-wet boundary of Muirhead. This is a "major" pre-planning application in outline stage and requires a 12 week public consultation period which will finish in July. Muir homes will have to submit a detailed full planning application after that if they want to take this further. Virtual presentations in May and a drop-in session (June 7th, Muirhead Church, 5.00pm -7.00pm) are planned.

Information is also available on Angus Council's website (anguscouncil@angus.gov.uk) and on Muirhead Birkhill and Liff CC's website (mblcc.co.uk) and facebook page. As an adjacent Community Council with a boundary quite close to the north boundary of the proposed development we will obviously be taking an interest in this and the public can, of course, have their say. We'll keep you posted.

The Mystery of the Moving Water

Many communities have historical mysteries, resolved and unresolved. Here in Auchterhouse we have a mystery which has been going on for about 20 years or more and this one is so far unresolved and unexplained. To set the scene I have to go back many decades to the time when the old original village of Auchterhouse took its water from springs rising in the Sidlaw Hills. The water flowed into the burn and was eventually piped into the original houses.

This is the story I have been told. Back up the hill north of the Funny Neuk path, some the water flows into the Hodge Burn which eventually flows into the Dighty and out to sea at Monifieth. The remaining water flows under the Funny Neuk path, through a marshy area and on across the gardens of the houses on the Brae. It goes under Whisky Road then appears above ground beside 2 houses, forming an interesting garden feature then across a field at the back of Parkside.

It is piped across the field and then reappears in some of the gardens in Parkside where one house has formed it into a pond. It then joins the main drain on the Brae. On Whisky Road a separate tank fills and takes the water down to the old village where it still serves three houses with useful garden water for a greenhouse and a toilet.



Those are the facts. The mystery is why would someone continue to divert the water from following this path from the hill to the village? In the past it has been diverted at the junction with the Hodge Burn, causing all the water to go down the Hodge Burn. So, causes drying up the burn running through the gardens and preventing the tank from filling.

This is bad enough as this burn hosts many wee water beasties as well as water plants, all providing valuable and much needed wetland habitat. It also means the three houses lose their garden water supply. Recently though, the burn was blocked where it goes under the Funny Neuk path which caused the water to flood all the way down the path, making it nigh on impossible for many folk who just wish to enjoy a pleasant ramble over our lovely hills.

The question is who and why? We would like to resolve this amicably and to everyone's satisfaction. If anyone reading this article knows anything about this and can answer the questions, please get in touch with me.

CPR/Defibrillator Training

The training session which was cancelled in March 2020 was held in March this year in Auchterhouse Hall – it's been a long wait! The session was again run by Helen Brady from Heartstart Discovery. This time the group was quite small – only six people – but everyone enjoyed it and found it extremely useful. The session focussed more on using a defibrillator as well as CPR this time which was good for us. There was a mixture of practical experience (the dummies stop at the waist so can be put up on a couple of chairs for people like me who couldn't get down to the floor) and explanation and questions.

Training defibrillators allowed us to try the practicalities involved in using the machine safely and effectively and we learned a few things we didn't know before which has prompted me to put a notice in our own defibrillator about scissors, razor and cloth! The whole session lasted about an hour and a half and Helen Brady's presentation was, as always, excellent and engrossing. NHS Tayside is continuing to fund Heartstart Discovery so we will hope to arrange a further session or two in the autumn.

For those who'd like to feel more confident about how to use our own defibrillator in an emergency along with CPR and also for those who would like a revision session (once a year is recommended) Helen's training session is highly recommended. We'll keep you posted about further dates.

We are awaiting the contractor to come in to clear and remove the large area of pine (near the forest road) flattened by Arwen – maybe in June! Meanwhile the clearing of poor and windblown trees is being carried out in many areas by Dirk and Andrew.

Most of our remaining oaks got planted in March / April in areas cleared within the pine woods which still leaves some lime for planting in the late autumn along with alder and silver birch cur rently on order.

Many thanks are due to everyone who kindly donated to the Aviva Community Fund Crowdfunding appeal. This raised over £6,500 to build up our coffers which had been running low and will help for all ongoing costs linked to managing the wood. The appeal is still open.

Dirk has applied for funding from Nature Scot to pay for the time to be spent by our chainsaw experts to get the wood safe and thinned ready for planting with oak (in clearings in the pine). This is the future for the wood to plant, or encourage regeneration of broadleaved trees like oak, beech and sycamore in clearings throughout.


